



HOW TO REDUCE LANDFILL



Gift it

Donate items to charity, gift to friends or swap and sell.



Compost it

Create a compost bin, worm farm, or donate to a friend with chickens.



Reuse it

Avoid excess packaging and disposable cups and containers.



Drop it off

Utilise Containers for Change sites.

Drop off batteries, ink and pods to the Shire.



Skip it

For excess waste, arrange for a skip bin.

Recyclable items (only) can go in the Skip Bin at the Dumbleyung
Waste Site.



There are **four areas** for waste disposal:



** Mixed loads are to be separated and disposed into the correct sections, not doing so increases the running costs of the waste sites**



Mosquitoes can breed around your home and the only way to prevent infection of mosquito-borne diseases is prevention.

They will lay eggs in fresh or salty water, and often in containers that hold water. Common breeding sites include pot plant drip trays, ponds, pet bowls, old tyres and rubbish that may collect water.

Stop mosquitoes breeding around your home by following these simple steps:

- Empty out or discard containers and rubbish that may hold water.
- Clean out roof gutters to prevent water from pooling.
- Empty, clean and refill bird baths, stock troughs and pet water bowls at least once a week.
- Keep swimming pools properly maintained and free of debris.
- Empty wading pools at the end of each day.
- Stock garden ponds with fish to eat mosquito larvae.
- Cover rainwater and septic tank opening, wells or other large water containers with mosquito-proof mesh.
- Keep edges of dams and ponds clear of vegetation.





The best way to prevent a rodent infestation and in-turn Snakes, is to remove the food sources, water, and items that provide shelter for rodents.

TRAP UP!

Trap up rodents to decrease their population

- Choose an appropriate trap (snap and/or glue) and add bait to attract rodents.
- Set traps in anywhere there is evidence of rodent activity.
- Poison is not recommended because rodents may die in the walls or under the floors preventing you from removing it.
- If you suspect a rodent infestation, call a professional pest management company



CLEAN UP!

Clean up to eliminate rodent food and nesting sources.

- All trash should be thrown out as soon as you can. Make sure your lids on your bins close fully or tight-fitting.
- Eliminate clutter by cutting and removing grass/weed overgrowth. *Rodents like to make their homes in clutter*
- Remove all old vehicles and tyres.
- Elevate hay and woodpiles off the ground.
- Keep compost bins as far away from the house as possible.
- Food from vegetable gardens and fruit trees should not remain on the ground.

SEAL UP!

Seal up common entrances into the home

- Kitchen cabinets, refrigerators, stoves, closets, fireplaces, doors, windows, attic, basement, crawl spaces and electrical, plumbing, cable and gas lines
- Fix small holes with steel wool.
- Fix large holes with solid materials like metal & cement. These materials can be found at your local hardware stores.
- Sink holes and burrows outside your home should be covered by solidly packed dirt and monitored.

REGISTERING YOUR DOG / CAT

Registering and microchipping your dog is compulsory and the following rules set out in the Dog Act 1976 must be followed:

- · Your dog/cat must be registered with the Shire of Dumbleyung once it is 3 months old and older and keep it registered.
- Attach the registration tag and a name tag with your name, address and phone number to your dog/cat's collar.
- · Registered dogs/cats must be kept within the confines of your property at all times (except on a leash when walking outside the property).
- · Pick up after your dog if it defecates in a public area.

FIREBREAKS

Inspections will commence following 18th October. Fines may be issued for non compliance.

Due 18th October



What is a Firebreak?

A firebreak is a strip of land that has been cleared of all trees, shrubs, grass or other flammable materials to allow access for firefighting vehicles to all areas of your property, and act as a barrier to help stop or slow a low-intensity fire.

More details listed in your issued Fire Hazard Reduction Notice



Do I need a Firebreak?

Short Answer: YES

Long Answer: PURSUANT to the powers contained in Section 33 of the Bushfire Act 1954, you are hereby required to have a fire break clear of all inflammable material on:





TOWNSITES

Townsite land 0.40ha or less, the whole of the property is to be cleared of flammable material (**front and backyards**).

Vacant blocks over 0.4ha require a 2m boundary firebreak.

Woodpiles/fuel storage areas/ garden refuse piles and green power domes must have a **perimeter firebreak**.





RURAL

3 meter wide clearance to mineral earth (clear of any shrubs, grass or other flammable material).

Additional **0.5m** gap on either side obstruction free. You should be able to walk/drive over it safely.

Height of 4 meters of overhanging branches to prevent blocked access of firefighting vehicles.





RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

19th September to 31st October & 1st February to 31st March

It is unlawful to set fire to the bush during this time except in accordance with a permit obtained.

WHY DO I NEED A PERMIT?

A permit is required to ensure that open burning is conducted safely and under controlled conditions. reducing the risk of wildfires during periods when dry, hot, and windy weather increases the likelihood of uncontrollable fire spread

The permit process provides guidelines that help manage the timing and location of burning. thereby reducing risks fire vulnerable areas.

WHEN/HOW TO GET A PERMIT?

During the Restricted Burning Period it is unlawful to burn without a permit.

PRIOR TO BURNING, you will need to obtain a permit from a Fire Control Officer (FCO) to burn grass piles. paddocks or bush.

FINES UP TO \$5000 MAY BE ISSUED FOR BURNS WITHOUT A PERMIT OR IF PERMIT CONDITIONS AREN'T MET.

WHAT YOU CAN DO?

Use of Wood/Solid Fuel BBOs, Pizza Ovens & Fire Pits.

Campfires to be no more that 1m x 1m. All are to be raised and located in a cleared area, away from trees or tall/drv grass.

EXCEPT when the Fire Danger Rating is High or above, when a Total Fire Ban has been declared. Permits are invalid during those times.

MUST HAVE fire preventions in place such as a hose.

WHAT YOU CANT DO?

Burning of grass, paddock, bush and bonfires without a permit.

Burning when the FDR is High or above or during a Total Fire Ban.

THINGS TO CHECK!

- . Check the Fire Danger Rating for the area, CANNOT burn during High and over.
- · Check that there is NO Total Fire
- · Have the ability to contain, control and extinguish your burn. means, you have suitable fire fighting equipment onsite for the duration of the burn.
- Make sure there is more than one person doing the burn. Do not leave your burn unattended.
- · Call the Department of Fire & **Emergency Services Communication** Centre on 9395 9210 and register prior to your burn.



PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

1st November to 31st January \otimes Good Friday & Easter Sunday

NO BURNING ALLOWED!

If you light a fire during a Prohibited Burning Period, you could be fined or even imprisoned.



THIS MEANS:

NO Backyard Garden Waste burn-offs.

NO Bonfires or Fire Pits.

NO Campfires.

NO Paddock burns.

NO Open Flamed BBQs.

NO Open Flamed Pizza Ovens.



DRESS CODE AT FIRES

Registered Bushfire Volunteers must present to a fire with the orange fire-fighting PPE, gloves, goggles and respirator.



HVMB

HARVEST & VEHICLE MOVEMENT BAN

Christmas and New Years Day (Issued by the Shire)

A Harvest and Movement Ban is the temporary cease of operations of engines, vehicles, plant machinery & hotworks during times where the risk of a bushfire is high.

MIN. TRAINING

Only registered Bushfire Volunteers who have completed the minimum Rural Bushfire Awareness Course can attend a fire!



Burning Periods

JAN FEB MAR APR MAY JUN JUL AUG SEPT OCT NOV DEC



PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD

November - JanuaryALL burning is prohibited during this period.



RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD

February - March & September - October Burning is permitted ONLY in accordance with a permit, and follow permit conditions.



BURNING ALLOWED

April - August

No permits required, still exercise caution.

Permits to burn during the **Restricted Burning Periods** can only be obtained from a Dumbleyung Fire Control Officer (FCO).

It is the responsibility of the permit holder to check that there is **NO Total Fire Ban** imposed, or that the Fire Danger Rating (FDR) is not HIGH or ABOVE, permits are invalid during those times.

Consider relocating to family/friends first. Use evacuation centres as a last resort.



Prepare your Property

Give your property the best chance against a bushfire, by using this checklist. Set reminders to do these jobs on a regular basis:

Cut long grass and dense scrub. Remove dead material from around the property.

٦	Remove all rubbish & rake up
	leaf litter.

- Have a 2m gap from the house & tree branches.
- ☐ Keep your gutters free of leaves.☐ Store firewood away from any
- buildings.
- Ensure gas bottles are secured.



CONNECT



Identify a personal support network:

Include people who can help you during and after an emergency. This could be family, friends, neighbours or a carer.

Identify a meeting place:

- Agree on a **location that everyone can meet** at, should you not be able to get home or if there is a communication disruption.
- Identify someone who can be your **out-of-town contact**. Agree to go to their place if you can't return home. Record their contact and share with your support network.

Record Important Contacts:

Write down important contact numbers, including friends and family members, your out-of-town contact, your doctor, other services you access regularly.

Don't forget details for schools, childcare centres, nursing homes and any other organisations you'll need to be in contact with during and after an emergency.

PACK



Have a note on the top of your kit to remember to grab: Phone and Charger, Wallet and Medications.

Having an emergency kit is an important step in being emergency ready.

A pre-prepared kit will save you valuable time.

Remember to check your kit regularly and replace any out of date items.

Below is a list of suggested items you may want to include in your kit:



Torch and batteries (packed separate)



Toiletries



Non perishable food



Spare Clothes



Pet food and supplies



Water



USB with scanned documents

(passport, wills, drivers licence, birth certificate, photos of valuable items etc)



Radio and batteries (packed separate)



First Aid Kit



Baby food and supplies





EVACUATE

An evacuation may be either pre-warned or immediate. It involves the movement of people to a safer location away from a hazard.



When an evacuation is declared it will be advertised on all possible means of media.

Listen to instructions given by authorities, as your closest evacuation centre might not even be in Dumbleyung.
